Seven Sacraments

Nicolas Poussin (1594-1665)

P ainted in Rome by the French artist Nicolas Poussin, the *Seven Sacraments* (c. 1637–1642) is one of the greatest sets of paintings in the history of Western art. The founder of the classical tradition in French art, Poussin, aimed to achieve a noble and pure style of painting, preferring to paint for private patrons who shared his scholarly interests.

He was known to have he kept a small box rather like a miniature theatre, in which he arranged wax models and altered the lighting in order to help him with the layout of his complex compositions.

Poussin painted two sets of the *Seven Sacraments*, the first for Cassiano dal Pozzo in Rome. The dates of execution for the Pozzo set are unknown, but they were not completed until 1642, when the final one was sent by Poussin from Paris to Rome.

Poussin and dal Pozzo picked the scenes of Christian life that would best exemplify the rituals of the sacraments illustrating them with scenes from the New Testament, or the earliest days of Christianity. The Pozzo series was extremely famous in its day. When acquired by the 4th Duke of Rutland in 1786, they counted amongst the finest works in the Duke's collection.

This Pozzo series is remarkable for its clarity, symmetry and quiet restraint, with drama created through gesture and contrasts of light and shade.

The cover of the Chrism Mass booklet features four of his paintings from the Pozzo series relating to the sacraments for which the oils are used: Baptism (Oil of Chrism and Catechumens), Confirmation (Oil of Chrism), Ordination (Oil of Chrism) and Anointing of the Sick (Oil of the Sick).

THE CHRISM MASS

T his celebration of the Eucharist takes its name from one of the holy oils which will be blessed or consecrated tonight. At this Liturgy—unique to the Cathedral of each Diocese—all of us gather to pray with the bishop and his collaborators, the priests of the Diocese, in thanksgiving and praise to God, and to pray for them as they renew their commitment to the service of God and his priestly people.

All those who follow Jesus' call are anointed with the Oil of Catechumens and the Chrism at their Baptism, and again with Chrism at their Confirmation. Those called to serve as priests and bishops are also anointed with the Chrism at their ordinations. Chrism is further used for the anointings pertaining to the dedication of churches and altars.

At the Chrism Mass, then, the priestly people gather with the bishop to celebrate the blessing of the Oil of Catechumens and the Chrism with which men and women are brought into God's priestly people and men are ordained to the priesthood.

Finally, God's priestly people are called to a ministry of healing. In the sacrament of healing known as the Anointing of the Sick, oil is again used to anoint the ill and infirm, and so the healing Church gathers tonight as the bishop blesses this Oil of the Sick.

Taking holy oils blessed by our chief pastor for sacramental use to each of the parishes in the local church of Wollongong is a sign of our unity being in communion with our bishop and with each other.

During the Eucharistic Prayer, the bishop invites all to remember the living and the dead.

Pray for all the living people in our Diocese tonight: young, middleaged and seniors; for our parishes and schools, and works of service and outreach; for our clergy, our seminarians, religious, teachers, catechists; and for those who are challenged by illness, poverty, or disability.

Pray for the dead: our own deceased relatives, friends and benefactors, all the faithful departed.

Please be especially mindful of our deceased first Bishop Thomas McCabe, second Bishop William Murray and the deceased clergy who have served our diocese, especially Fr Eugene Weber (RIP 29 September 2019) amd Fr Douglas Rheinberger (RIP 2 July 2020) who died since the last Chrism Mass.

Requiescant in pace.

PRESENTATION & BLESSING OF THE OILS

The oils are placed at the altar. These oils consist of a mixture of pure olive oil and various perfumes.



OIL OF CATECHUMENS Oleum Sanctorum (OS)

This oil is used to initiate candidates for Baptism. As a sign of new life and growth, it is veiled in **GREEN**.



OIL OF THE SICK Oleum Infirmorum (OI)

This oil offers healing and strength to the suffering and reminds us that despite our frailty and vulnerability, God's forgiveness is all-embracing. It is veiled in **VIOLET**, the penitential colour.

OIL OF CHRISM Sacrum Chrisma (SC)

Chrism is a sign: by Baptism we are plunged into the Paschal Mystery of Christ; we die for him, we are buried with him, and we rise with him; we share in the priesthood, and through Confirmation we receive the anointing of the Holy Spirit which is given to us. As it is always associated with festive occasions, it is veiled in **WHITE**.
